
School District #40 New Westminster Aboriginal Enhancement Agreement

On October 7th, 2004, SD #40 signed the Enhancement Agreement at a traditional Sto:Lo feast and ceremony hosted by our elder in residence, Se'qwa:ynten (Danny Charlie). The collective responsibility for promoting the success of all Aboriginal student in SD #40 is acknowledged through the partnership between the Aboriginal and Educational communities and the Ministry of Education.

Goals of Aboriginal Education

- To increase the involvement of Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal students with Aboriginal Culture
- To improve Aboriginal students performance at the intermediate level in and reading and writing
- To improve the grade-to-grade transition rate at the secondary level and secondary school completion rate of Aboriginal students
- To reduce the percentage of Aboriginal Students identified in Ministry of Education Behaviour categories in New Westminster




About the logo:

This logo has been approved by Chief Rhonda Larrabee of the New Westminster (Qayqayt) First Nation for use by Aboriginal Education programs in School District No 40.

The double headed serpent is a supernatural symbol that can be interpreted in a variety of ways. This traditional educational symbol deals with the concept of choice. The story of the double headed serpent reminds us to always work on choosing a balance of forces in our lives.

The design uses coastal art forms from the Salish and Kwakuitl Bands and was created by Xwa'lack tun, a Salish artist and his son, James Harry, who is a New Westminster Secondary School Graduate.
